Hampton Wildlife Fund Receives Grant from Dominion Energy

Grant supports marine science education of Charleston area elementary students

The Harry R.E. Hampton Wildlife Fund has received a \$5,000 Environmental Education and Stewardship Grant from Dominion Energy.

The grant will support the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR) Carolina Coastal Discovery Marine Education Program, a day-long, outdoor environmental education program geared to helping students actively learn the South Carolina State Science Curriculum Standards, exposing students to STEM careers, and creating a new generation of environmental stewards of the Charleston area marine ecosystem.

In 2016, 34% of all South Carolina 5th grade students scored "Not Met" on the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) in science, indicating a clear learning gap (SC Dept. of Education, 2016) and the need for additional methods of teaching science standards. Our hands-on approach to learning improves students' understanding and retention of science standards.

Students spend their day in our outdoor classroom and aboard the 40' catamaran *Discovery*, where a SCDNR educator leads the students in handson activities such as dissections or marine life identifications. Students use the tools of a marine scientist to reinforce the state science standards and their real- world applications. The educators also work to help the students understand their role in sustaining this unique marine environment by practicing wise stewardship. More than 250 students from Charleston area schools will participate in the program.

"As part of Dominion Energy's ongoing commitment to environmental sustainability, we are thrilled to work with Hampton Wildlife Fund by supporting innovative education programs for South Carolina's students," said Kristen Beckham, external affairs representative for Dominion Energy. Hampton (1897-1980), a S.C. journalist and conservationist who was instrumental in the establishment of the Congaree National Park and the S. C. Wildlife Commission, which later evolved into the SCDNR. Mr. Hampton was also the first president of the S.C. Wildlife Federation. The fund was begun to endow scholarships in his name and fund conservation projects in South Carolina through the SCDNR, thus continuing his legacy of stewardship.

HWF has provided \$3.65 million in financial support to a wide diversity of projects and activities since its inception. In addition, the Fund has awarded over \$472,000 in scholarships to deserving South Carolina students majoring in environmental science or related fields, journalism and law enforcement/criminology.
